Yes, we have a team that works on these. I just do the easy part. I get to have the conversations, but we have audio technicians and a team that puts all the correct links together, publishes them, tags people on LinkedIn, and gets the word out. Thank you all very much. As we look back to January, 2018 and the year of 2018, where were we at with green buildings and healthy buildings? LEED was continuing to go strong. It was growing on many fronts, especially LEED for existing buildings. WELL, and Fitwell were new on the scene and there were only a couple of years, two, three years in. We hadn't had the pandemic yet. We had LEED, but we didn't have a lot of clients going all in on WELL and FitWell, only some early adopters. ESG has made its way really into new construction, but it was sneaking up more on the existing building side and is this a green portfolio or not? That's kind of where we

were in 2018. Roll around to 2019, still some growth with LEED with the economy.

Charlie (<u>04:15</u>):

The 2020 pandemic hits. We're fortunate that our small, but growing businesses have been okay through the pandemic. In part because we have great customers, great clients, and we're in a kind of recession resistant industry, green buildings, healthy buildings, education, and trying to just improve everyone's careers and give them access to all this material. A lot of our customers did retool to grab some extra credentials and do that. Continuing ed they've been putting off. Luckily some clients were very consistent with LEED, and also embraced recertifying their LEED for Existing Building Projects, their ARC performance scoring projects. Of course, this is a healthy building or not 2020 into 2021 this year? We saw a lot of growth with WELL and Fitwell credentials and of course certifications and the viral response system.

Charlie (<u>05:19</u>):

It's been a pretty wild four years. When I look back, I also wanted to go through some of the career advice notes. Our team has put together a list of all that great advice that's given on our podcast. Is it a common theme? Do you love to do what you do? Follow your passion. Really stretch yourself, say yes to more things early in your career. And then you can focus on certain things later in your career, just chase opportunity. You'll find listening to this podcast is very encouraging. It's about storytelling and we're going to keep this format for the foreseeable future. It's 30 to 45 minutes an episode, we've got access to some incredible guests that are on all spectrums of their green building journey.
